**ORDER FOR POST-CONVICTION DNA TESTING  
FACILITY & PROCEDURE**

IT IS NOW HEREBY ORDERED that samples of the physical evidence within the State's possession are submitted for DNA testing at the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory (hereinafter "Lab") at the following address:

1. The following samples shall be tested by the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory:

Item 6:	Carmex Package recovered from Goodspeed rental car on 2/1/96

2. The cost of testing shall be paid for by the Midwest Innocence Project. The Kansas City Police Crime Lab shall ensure that the evidence is properly packaged so that it is not damaged during testing or handling of any sort and that the appropriate chain of custody procedures is followed. The Lab shall follow all of its applicable policies, procedures, and protocols during the course of all work performed in this case.

3. Defense counsel may determine the order and manner in which DNA testing proceeds, except as specifically provided herein where consumption is likely. The State is not entitled to direct or participate in defense counsel's consultations with the Lab and defense's decisions regarding order or manner of testing, except as specifically provided herein.

4. In the event that the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory determines, prior to conducting the DNA testing or analysis of a particular item of evidence, that the DNA testing will result in consumption of the available DNA material from a particular item of evidence, then the Lab shall suspend the testing process and shall comply with this procedure:

The Lab shall give simultaneous email notification to both the State and the Defense, that testing of the specific DNA swab or available specimen will result in consumption. When

counsel for both sides receive such notice from the Lab, counsel for both sides shall meet and confer to discuss the testing procedure before it goes forward. Both sides shall have the opportunity to meet and confer together with the Lab as to the testing procedure to be utilized on the particular item of evidence and available DNA material. The Lab may proceed with the DNA testing upon the written agreement of both sides or court order. In the event counsel for both sides are unable to agree on the testing of such specimen or item that will be consumed by the testing process, counsel may file written objection with the court within five (5) days of email notice given by the Lab.

5. Upon completion of all DNA testing requested by the defense, the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory shall publish its results in a report that shall be simultaneously provided via email and United States Postal Service to the attorneys for the parties listed below. The underlying data for all of the tests and testing that is conducted in this case shall also be retained and made available to the State (as well as to the defense).

6. If Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory is able to obtain one or more DNA profiles from the evidence and foreign to the victims, and Mr. Kidd is excluded as the source of the profile(s), the State shall compare the profile(s) to convicted-offender profiles, specifically **Gary Goodspeed Jr., AKA Rahib Muwwakkil, B/M DOB 11/28/73**, in the state and federal DNA databanks and disclose the results to the Petitioner and Respondent. Profiles will also be compared to a referent sample for **Gary Goodspeed, Sr., AKA Abu Saad Muwwakkil (deceased), B/M DOB 9/20/56**, which may be developed from Item 6, the Carmex package.


7. Any unused portion of extracted DNA, amplified DNA, and any unused portion of the evidentiary substrate material, as well as any and all biological standards, shall be kept

sealed and stored in a scientifically acceptable manner upon completion of testing by Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory.

8. To the extent that counsel for the Petitioner and the Respondent have agreed to portions of this order, their agreements and stipulations are for purposes of subjecting the herein described items to DNA testing procedures. The parties have not stipulated to any conclusions that may be drawn or any meaning of the results from DNA testing.


